#### **Creative use of GA dollars**

- Overall GA budget likely to decrease
- Strategic and creative use of GA dollars will be necessary
- Consider options such as:
  - Resident tuition coverage for international and non-resident, domestic students
  - Half time GA awards
  - Stipend only



#### **GA Award Letter Template**

- Graduate Council reviewing the possibility of standardizing award letters
- Potential to offer awards through Slate post-admission
  - Increased trackability
  - Reporting on award accepts and declines
  - Increased confidence in enrollment
  - Help identify new TAs in need of TA training
  - Help generate list of new GAs who will need I-9 paperwork

### **Enrollment Management Considerations**

Each program may have different answers to these questions

- Can I increase the number of awards by decreasing award levels?
- Can I increase enrollment through the creative use of GA funding?
- What level of funding is necessary to attract the students I need?



### **GA Enrollment Requirements**

Students receiving a GA with scholarship and working 15 or 20 hours per week must remain enrolled in a minimum of 9 credit hours per semester

Students receiving a GA with scholarship and working 10 hours per week must remain enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester

Applicable enrollment requirements must be maintained throughout the contract period for the academic term specified



#### **Graduate Student Awards**

- Awards Deadline is January 11, 2024 at 12 p.m. (noon)
- Eligibility Requirements: Minimum of 3.0 GPA and Current CSU Graduate Student or Less than a Year Since they Graduated from CSU with a Graduate Degree
- Creative Scholarship Awards: One \$500 Award Each for a Doctoral and Master's Student and One \$250 Award Each for a Doctoral and Master's Student
- Master's and Doctoral Research Awards: Twelve Total Awards of \$500 or \$250
- Graduate Student Teaching Award: One \$500 and One \$250 Award
- Graduate Student TA Award: One \$500 and One \$250 Award
- Graduate Student Engagement and Social Advocacy Award: One \$500 and One \$250 Award
