Course Repeat/Grade Forgiveness

- New policy goes in effect Fall 2024
- Students may repeat up to 2 graduate courses, 2 times each.
 - New grade replaces the original grade (even if it is lower) in GPA calculation.
 - Original grade stays on the transcript with the note "Course Repeated,"
 Attempt Forgiven."
- Students can repeat a course w/o limit on the original grade.
 - Only applies to courses where a letter grade can be earned.
- Does not apply to courses repeated prior to Fall 2024.



Course Repeat/Grade Forgiveness

- Working with IS&T and Registrar's Office on implementation.
- Does not apply to courses with alternate course repeat options.
 - Need to work with departments to clean up this list.
- If a student repeated a course multiple times prior to Fall 2024, they still have one additional chance to repeat the course and take advantage of the new policy.
- Newest attempt at the course will overwrite the grade for all previous attempts.




Thesis/Dissertation Deadlines

- Students must defend their thesis/dissertation by the end of the 10th week of the semester in fall and spring (end of the 7th week for summer semester).
- The final document must be submitted to the College of Graduate Studies for format review by the end of the 13th week of the semester in fall and spring (10th week of summer semester).
- Exemptions from these deadlines may be granted by the Dean of the College of Graduate Studies in cases where the student's defense is delayed for unexpected reasons outside the student's control.




Starfish – week 2 survey
