- Spring 2023 Workshop Summary:
 - 10 Workshops for Students and 2 Workshops for Faculty Being Hosted
 - 9 Student Workshops Hosted So Far with 138 Total Attendees and 105 Unique Students Attending
 - 67 Master's Students, 37 Doctoral Students, and 1 Post-doc
 - 69 International Students and 36 Domestic Students
 - Attendees from All Colleges except Law
 - Top Programs: 18 Students from Computer Science, 12 Students from Mechanical Engineering, 12 Students from Electrical Engineering

- Excludes The College of Law
- Excludes Centralized Application System (CAS) Programs



Duolingo

- Duolingo is now an approved test of English language proficiency.
- The table provides cutoffs for admission and TA assignment.

GA contracts

Students receiving a GA with scholarship and working 15 or 20 hours per week must remain enrolled in a minimum of 9 credit hours per semester

New - Students receiving a GA with scholarship and working 10 hours per week must remain enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester

Applicable enrollment requirements must be maintained throughout the contract period for the academic term specified



Transfer Credit

Courses with S grades may be transferred to CSU if the department demonstrates it is standard in their discipline for the course to be graded S/U. The program director should submit their justification of the course along with the transfer credit form for review.

Approved Graduate Credit Transfers are noted on student's transcripts with a TR in lieu of a grade and do factor into the GPA. To be eligible for transfer a student must have earned a grade of B or better.

Transfer credits are not applied to a student's transcript until they have earn 12 or more credits as a CSU graduate student and are in good standing.



Thesis & Dissertation Formatting

- Minimum Requirements for ETD PDFs in the OhioLINK ETD Center
 - PDF file includes full text
 - PDF accessibility permission flag is checked
 - Text language of the PDF is specified
 - Figures and images include alternative text
 - PDF includes a title





Thesis & Dissertation Formatting

- Compliance will be checked and enforced by the College of Graduate Studies as part of the format review.
- Recommend that students writing their manuscript in Word utilize the
 Accessibility Checker and Save as PDF, which will carry forward the accessibility
 formatting into the PDF file.
- Graduate Studies will also run an accessibility report on the PDF file. Students must correct issues before submitting to OhioLINK.
- This is an OhioLink requirement.



Graduate Faculty Requirements

- Our graduate faculty membership requirements are old and reflect the pre-2.0 college structures.
- In fall we will begin the process of updating graduate faculty membership requirements
- For now, we will continue to evaluate applications based on the existing criteria.



Starfish for Graduate Students

- Starfish is being extended to our graduate population with the aim of improving retention and completion. Benefits of this implementation include:
 - Connecting students with recourses
 - Tracking mid-term performance for graduate students
 - Facilitating communication between faculty and academic advisors
 - Providing for more timely interventions aimed at preventing academic dismissals
 - Collecting data to drive the development of programing
- Implementation is on track to be active for the Fall 2023 term.
- More information, including training opportunities, will be forthcoming.
